(R.C.M. §11-714).

ORDINANCE NO. 168

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Fromberg:

An Ordinance amending the Fromberg Municipal Code and providing against the discharging of firearms, B-B guns, air guns and slingshots within the town limits, and changing Title 6, Chapter 4, Section 04.

Section 6-4-04 of the Fromberg Municipal Code shall be amended as follows:

6-4-04 DISORDERLY CONDUCT. No person shall knowingly disturb the public peace by:

- (a) Quarreling, challenging to fight or fighting; or
- (b) Making loud or offensive noises; or
- (c) Using threatening, profane or abusive language; or
- (d) Discharging firearms within the town limits;
"Firearms," shall include BB guns, air guns, pellet guns, sling shots, or any other device which is capable of hurling an object with sufficient force to damage or injure any property; or
- (e) Transmitting a false report of a fire; or
- (f) Transmitting a false report of a crime or an alleged crime.

- B. Children in the age group of 12 through 17:
Weekdays, Sunday through Friday - 11:00PM to 6:00AM
Weekends, Friday through Sunday - 1:00AM to 6:00AM

6-5-02 DUTY OF PARENT OR GUARDIAN. No parent, guardian,
of any child coming within the provision of this chapter
shall allow or permit such child to go or be in or upon the
public thoroughfares or other public places in the town after





AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO MONTANA-DAKOTA UTILITIES CO., A CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE FRANCHISE AND RIGHT TO CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE WITHIN AND UPON, IN AND UNDER THE STREETS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC GROUNDS OF THE TOWN OF FROMBERG

A GAS DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM FOR TRANSMITTING AND DISTRIBUTING NATURAL OR MANUFACTURED GAS, OR A MIXTURE OF BOTH, FOR ALL PUBLIC AND PRIVATE USE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY

TOWN OF FROMBERG

SECTION I. For convenience, herein, said municipal corporation is designated and referred to as "Municipality" and Montana-Dakota Utilities Co. is designated and referred to as "Grantee". Any reference to either includes their respective successors and assigns.

SECTION II. There is hereby granted to Montana-Dakota Utilities Co., a corporation, Grantee, its successors and assigns, subject to the limitations herein stated, the right and franchise to occupy and use the streets, alleys and public grounds of the municipality as now, or hereafter constituted, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining, and operating, within, upon, in and under the same, a gas distribution system for transmitting and distributing natural or manufactured gas, or a mixture of both, for all public and private use.

SECTION III. Grantee shall maintain an efficient distribution system for furnishing natural or manufactured gas, or a mixture of both, for public and private use at such reasonable rates, and under such regulations as may be approved by the Public Service Commission of the State wherein said municipality is located.

SECTION IV. This franchise shall not be exclusive and shall not be construed to prevent the Municipality from granting to any other party the right to use the streets, alleys, and public grounds of the Municipality for like purposes.

SECTION V. The Municipality reserves any right it may have, under its police power, or otherwise, to control or regulate the use of said streets, alleys and public grounds by Grantee.

SECTION VI. Grantee shall indemnify and save and hold the Municipality harmless from any loss or damage due to the construction, installation and maintenance of its distribution system, and its use of the streets, alleys and public grounds of the Municipality.

SECTION VII. Grantee shall have the right to assign this franchise to any party, or corporation, but all obligations of Grantee hereunder shall be binding upon its successors and assigns.

SECTION VIII. Within thirty (30) days after Grantee is notified of passage and final approval of this Ordinance, Grantee shall file with the clerk or auditor of the Municipality its written acceptance of this franchise.

SECTION IX. This franchise shall continue and remain in full force and effect for a period of twenty-five (25) years from the date upon which this ordinance shall become effective as provided by law.



HOURS OF OPERATION


9-5-01 HOURS OF OPERATION.

All licensed establishments in the town of Fromberg wherein alcoholic beverages are sold, offered for sale, or given away at retail shall be closed each day between 2:00 A.M. and 8:00 A.M., except that, establishments will be closed on Sunday between 2:00 A.M. and 1:00 P.M.


During the hours when the licensed establishments are required by this code to be closed, it shall be unlawful to sell, offer for sale, or give away any such alcoholic beverages. During such hours all persons, save the employees of such licensed establishment shall be excluded therefrom, provided however, that when the establishment is operated in conjunction with a hotel, restaurant, bus depot, railway terminal, or other business other than that of the sale of intoxicating liquor or beer, then such other business need not be closed, but only the part thereof where such beer or liquor is sold.

This Ordinance is intended to work in conjunction with all applicable State Laws regard control of alcoholic beverages.
